the East; and have come to


adore the Lord.

PERSONS OF DEPTH

The Magi or wise men remind us that we should be persons of depth. We are superficial when we limit our concerns to what we should wear, eat, or drink. We acquire depth when we involve God in our lives, striving to know God's will through a process we call discernment.

You are wise if you involve Jesus in your day-to-day decisions, when you ask his opinion over big and small matters. You want to follow his star, and like the wise men, you become confused and bothered once his star disappears. You cannot live without the light of God; you strive always to see reality under the guidance.

Many of us live empty lives because we do not give God any space in our existence. We remember God only in times of need and want. We pray when we are suffering from severe problems or incurable illnesses, but God remains far from us because we do not involve him in our decision-making. We are so sure of ourselves; we run to God only when we become desperate.


When you decided to get married, for instance, did you bother asking whether God was calling you to the married life? This is discernment. We open our hearts and minds to the mysterious voice of our Creator who gets involved in our lives if we allow him to.

As parents, do you ask God for guidance as to where you will send your children for school? Do young people ever wonder whether God agrees with their career choice or professional route? When we develop the habit of asking God for the decisions we make, especially the big ones, then we become, like the Magi, persons of depth.

When we involve God in our decisions, we will see our lives as completing our God-given mission. We acquire a purpose, a reason for living. We are on our way to happiness. A life without purpose is empty and sad. When we wake up each morning knowing that we will spend the day doing God's will for us, the warmth of God's light enters our hearts. We become contented and happy. Our day becomes a life celebration.

If you are superficial in your way of life, you will never be a witness to Jesus. Only men and women of depth can fulfill this purpose.

Recap FAQ about the Plenary

What is the Plenary Council?

Put simply, the Plenary is not only a meeting of bishops, but a process that calls for the participation of the entire Catholic Community. It invites the whole Church into dialogue, to discern how its communities can live the Gospel with renewed vitality amidst new questions and challenges. We are all invited to consider, reflect, and respond to the question: What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?

Why is it important?

The Australian Church is going through a period of crisis. This is an opportunity to have your voice heard and to contribute to the reshaping of the Catholic church in Australia. It is our responsibility to take leadership of the future of the Australian Catholic church. Our voices matter. Therefore, we pray, we reflect, we listen, we speak, and importantly, we stand together hopeful of a revival of the Church.

What are the important dates?
There are three steps of preparation for the Plenary. (Please refer to last week's bulletin for more information.)

Open Listening and Dialogue
This began at Pentecost 2018
and will continue until Ash
Wednesday 2019 (March 6).
We have until Ash Wednesday
to submit our responses to
the question online to

www.plenarycouncil.catholic.org. au.

Dialogue and Discernment:
This will commence after
Easter in 2019 and will end
before Christmas in the same

year.

Dialogue and Formation:

This will commence <u>early</u>

2020.

The first Plenary Council session will be held in October from $11^{th} - 17^{th}$ 2020. The second Plenary Council session will be held in May 2021.

What has our parish done so far?

We have had two meetings in the Parish in the Small Hall so far, inviting Fr Noel Connelly and Jacqui Giuliano (Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation) to guide our listening and dialogue regarding the Plenary. Many have formed their own group/s to continue this dialogue. There are no set 'rules' on how to go about this activity. We are all invited to listen and dialogue with each other in whatever way we feel most comfortable with. Where can I get further information?
